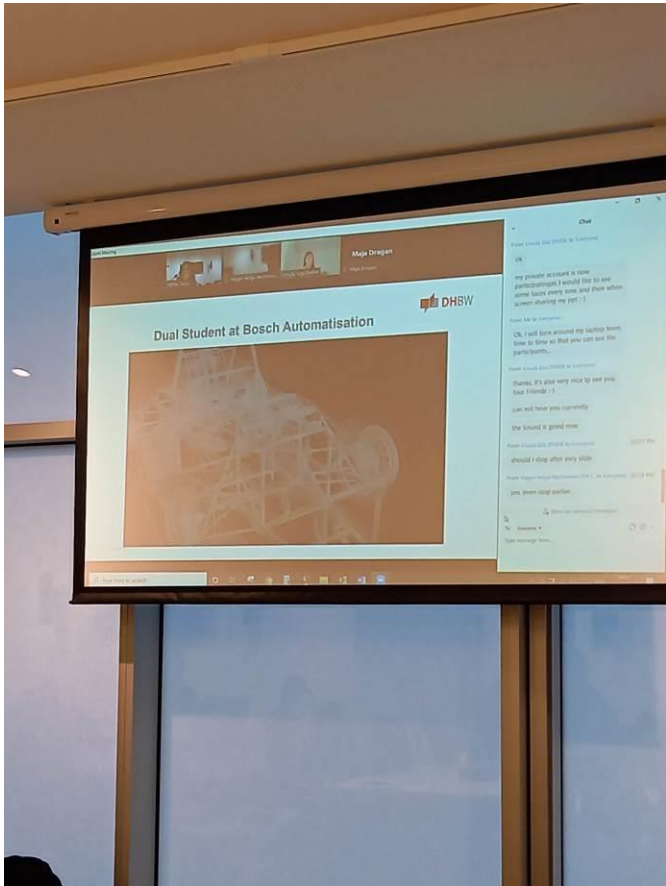

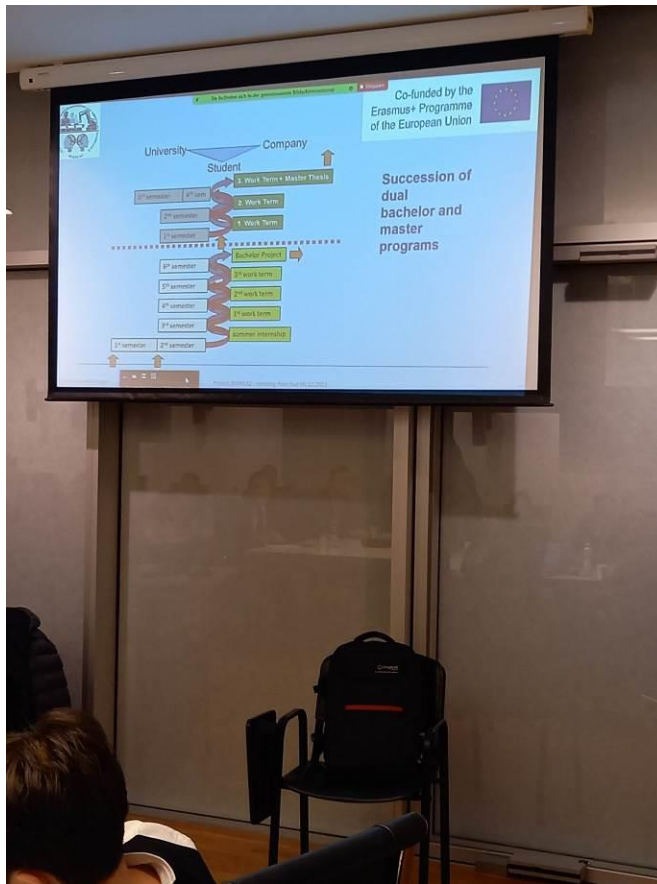

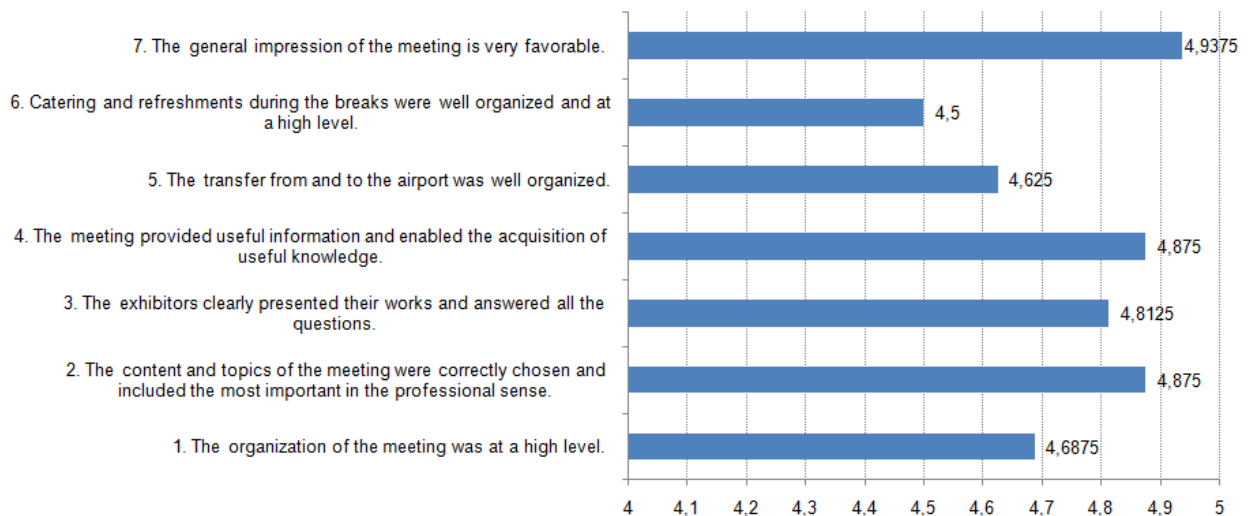
Participants Feedback
